




Place

-where particular places are located and the combination of features that make each place on earth distinct.

- Location- the position that something occupies on the earth's surface
 - Identified 3 ways
 - Topoynm- a name given to a place on earth (city names, names given by settlers)
 - Site- physical characteristic of a place (climate, soil, vegetation, elevation)
 - Situation location of a place relative to other places.





Region

Three types of Regions

- 1. Formal
- 2. Functional
- 3. Vernacular

Cultural Landscape

unified character

combo of cultural features (language/religion)

• economic features (agriculture/industry)

and physical features (climate/vegetation)






Formal Region

also known as a uniform region

- everyone shares one or more things in common
- cultural activities, economic activity
- characteristic is present throughout

Recognize diversity while making generalizations





Functional Region

also known as a nodal region

- area organized around a node or focal point
- tied to a central point by transportation, communication systems, or economic functional associations
- Examples- SRS, Savannah River, WJBF or WRDW

- also known as a perceptual region
- an area that people believe exists as part of their cultural identity.
- information sense of place
